## Good Technique Gives No Bonus

Mrs Baldursdottir, from Iceland was the first declarer of the day: Board I. Dealer North. None Vul.

The bidding was short: One Spade, Two Hearts, Two No trumps, Three No trumps.

By the way how much would you like to be in a no trump slam? Assuming you get a club lead it nothing less than a little under 60\% proposition - as a 3-3 break in either major suit is enough.

Declarer took the queen of clubs lead and went for spades. When she discovered the happy break, discarding a club from dummy, she should stop and draw 3 rounds of hearts to establish eventually a squeeze in the red suits against North. In fact, she continued with two more rounds of spades, North discarding 2 diamonds. After a long huddle, West decided to discard a diamond and a heart but as you can see there was no way to take more than 12 tricks.

## Spades, A Girl's Best Friend?

On board 2 the bidding was very short. South opened One Diamond, West, Jean Guillon of France overcalled with One Heart and that ended the bidding.

The lead was the ten of diamonds taken by declarer. When South came in with the king of hearts she played back a diamond and later two rounds of clubs after winning the ace of trumps. Now West could take nine tricks for 140, engineering a coup en passant.A spade shift after the first heart, difficult to find, would have held West to 8 tricks.

Mrs Pippet and Mr O'Lubaigh from Ireland opened the West hand Two Hearts, alerted as Tartan. The French pair seemed to have never heard of this convention, the explanation was that it showed 5 hearts and 4+ of an unknown minor. North overcalled with Two Spades and that finished the bidding. Declarer was clever enough to escape for one down, not such a good result when at other table East/West were happy to sacrifice in Five Diamonds for 300 against a cold Five Clubs.

Assuming West started with Three Hearts, South's 3NT will have concluded the auction. West leads the queen of hearts and declarer wins in dummy. We are sure many players will have run a diamond to West's queen at trick two. Back comes a heart and declarer wins and knocks out the ace of diamonds. Say East exits with a spade. Declarer wins in dummy, comes to hand with a diamond and plays a low club, intending to duck the trick to East. When West puts in an honour, declarer cashes the remaining winners in the pointed suits to forcr West down to Q 6 and the 8 J . Now declarer, who has a complete count, can exit with a heart to force West to lead into the split club tenace.

If North opens is and South responds with a forcing (or even non-forcing) notrump, you need a gadget to show your mediocre two suiter, if you want to show it at all. If you pass, North will bid 2 and South will raise. The kiss of death will be the outcome once South has the guts to axe whatever West does.

On the next board, dropping the singleton queen lands a very ambitious contract.

The only thing needed is to guess to play the $\mathbf{~} \mathrm{K}$ on the first round of the suit. The opposite results, $4 \bigcirc$ making and 4 down two are much more likely to occur, however...

One might expect the auction to be $1 \diamond-1 \Delta ; 2 N T-3 N T$ at nearly all tables. West hits the jackpot with a heart lead, but on the more likely club lead how would you tackle the diamond suit? The double finesse works, as the onside honour drops doubleton, and so does the interesting play of a diamond to the queen and a diamond back to the ace, which caters for jack doubleton on either side. With so many 600's on the scoresheets one wonders what has happened round the playing area.

The following board was a matter of counting declarer's points.

Board I3. Dealer North. All Vul.


South would open a 15-I7 NT most of the times, and West would lead a red suit. If he picks a heart, all will be well for the defence straight away, but after a diamond lead he will have to do some thinking. Declarer will win dummy's king and play two top clubs from hand, West ducking. Next comes a spade to the jack and another club. At this point, West has seen II of South's points ( $\wedge \mathrm{Q}, \stackrel{\mathrm{A}}{\mathrm{s}} \mathrm{K} \mathrm{K}$ ). A heart switch therefore looks in order.

South may or may not hold the A, but East will surely hold something interesting in hearts and West thus has to be quick, certainly if South holds the $\$$ as well.

Now imagine South, who is playing a $12-14$ NT, opened INT. All of a sudden, this reasoning no longer applies, as South simply cannot hold the $\$ \mathrm{~A}$ as well ( 15 hcp . in that case). So a diamond looks safe, but was not at the table I was watching. The second overtrick was worth a lot of matchpoints.

Say North is in Three Hearts after E/W pre-empted in diamonds. East leads the $\diamond \mathrm{A}$ and West contributes the eight, a Lavinthal suggestion for spades. East then duly switches to the 5 and West wins the Ace, which looks obvious as East cannot be misled. Now what should West return if North follows suit with the 2 ? This depends on your play agreements (4th or $3 \mathrm{rd} / 5$ th). To complicate matters, we repeat the question in case North plays the 10 on the first round of the suit.

The other side of the coin will be the theme of the very next board. Say West opens his weak major/minor two suiter with a Polish style 2 V . If North still ends up in 3NT, there might be a problem for the defence. East will duly find the diamond lead and West will win the ace and return the suit. But which card should West play? If he returns the classic 4th best (the $\diamond 5$ ) the suit is blocked. With the diamond length already given, West can afford to return the 10 or the 8 , but not if the minor "suit" may well consist of three cards only, as we saw at one table...

Another nice case of which suit to return, and when, we saw just one board later. North, green v. red, would open $4 \oslash$ in sec-

When East makes the very good lead of the ducked in dummy, what should West continue after winning the Q ? At this point there is ambiguity in the air. The $\mathbf{~ K}$ is as good as anything, but it does not give East a clear count, even less so when North contributes the ten. Still, cashing the $\$$ after winning the $8 \mathbf{A}$ at the second attempt should be in order, as the possible diamond loser will go on the clubs only if declarer holds at least AQx in the suit. Cashing the $\diamond \mathrm{A}$ first might lead to disaster, as you can see afterwards...

It needs a very careful defence to beat 3NT on this one:

likely card. If East is allowed to score the $\diamond 10$ and switches to a spade, declarer is lost and has to play well to escape for one down.

If North is declarer, a spade from East is probably best. Declarer will run this to his Jack, so West wins the trick and can switch to the desired low diamond after all. If he does not, declarer may get the timing right to make the contract - which happened at many, many tables.

Do you want to be thrown in? Well, any bridge player would intuitively say "no, thank you," but sometimes you have to help nature a little.

A popular auction would be: 4s best, double by North, passed out. Two down.

A variation will occur when West elects to open 14. Now North can overcall 28 , South will raise to game and West will be forced to go to 4 after all. Now, if N/S double, we are back to par for the hand, but when they go to 5 ), par will be beaten either way. Much depends on the lead and the desire to be thrown in.

If West is on lead, his troubles are over once he leads the $\diamond A$.
Or are they? This is a matter of definition. If a routine unblock is too much for West, his troubles will return later on. All he has to do is to go up with the K as soon as he gets the chance, and return the suit.

But if West switches to a club after the $\diamond A$ ? Now declarer can win the queen, eliminate the major suits and play and another. Of course, West has seen the danger and got rid of his K under the ace.

So far, so good. If East is on lead, the picture is different, except if she leads the $\diamond$ Q.This will be ducked in dummy and we are back in the variation above. On a spade lead, declarer will draw trumps, cash the other spade and lead a low club. Now, if West does not go up, cashes the $\diamond \mathbf{A}(!)$ and returns a club, the contract will be made. Bridge is an endlessly nice game, isn't it?

When the tray came under the screen following North's 4NT,West asked for an explanation from South. Alas, she had no idea, and could offer nothing plausible. The director was called but as he rightly pointed out, there was little he could do if South did not know. We have no idea what South did - our reporter left the scene before South had made her choice. We subsequently discovered that West went on to Five Spades, a contract that failed by two tricks.

Elsewhere, after an identical start South bid Five Hearts - and North is still trying to work out what that was supposed to mean.

So are we.
