## DENMARK TO FACE THE HOLDERS TODAY

After an exciting day's play, the final classification of this European Champions Cup is gradually becoming clear. After the first segment, Näsby led Allfrey by 69 but 24 boards later, their lead was just 10. In the end, they won by 67. In all other matches, the halftime imp differences did not exceed 29 and often were just single-figured. The third segment proved decisive in the Schaltz-Besiktas match, the Danish advantage rising to 44, but being only 24 down, Allegra were still in with a chance. In the other matches too, the imp differences with 12 to go were somewhere in the twenties. In the end, it turned out that all leaders had held on, some of them a little narrowly. So it's Parioli-Schaltz for the gold and Allegra-Besiktas for the bronze today.

## The Final Round

When the final round of the qualification started, nearly everything was still completely undecided. Of course, a few teams were effectively out already, but 8 or even 9 of the 12 participants were in with more than a theoretical chance of making it to the last four. This was mainly due to the fact that close rivals in the standings had to play each other in both groups. As a consequence, we saw some interesting matches, certainly in the beginning of the session when the boards were very wild. Here are a few examples, taken from two matches: Besiktas v. Brussels and Parioli v. Chlodnia.

Besiktas needed a good win to have any chance of catching up the Belgians and the Dutch, whereas in the other group Parioli looked a certain qualifier – but would they try to oust the Poles, thus offering the Danes and Russians the chance to fight it out between them?

We were not at all disappointed: Parioli did its duty and much more than that, scoring over 50 unanswered imps against Chlodnia to start with. In the other featured match, Besiktas took a big lead against the Belgians and held on to it, thus staying ahead of all their rivals, among them the Modalfa team from the Netherlands who were beaten severely by Allegra, the other Italian qualifier.

So it became clear at an early stage at Parioli and Allegra would meet today in one of the semis, but the other pairing remained undecided till the end of the session.

A few swings from both matches are shown below.

♠K lead and switch to the ♥J. The ♥Q won and the ♦J went to the ace. As declarer could not crossruff the whole hand he went down two after all, +300 to Besiktas.

2♦ showed a black two-suiter. On a trump lead, declarer had ample time to draw all the trumps and concede two clubs and a heart. East could not profitably attack the hearts to shorten declarer and West never got the lead to try the effect of the ♥Q! Brussels +620 and 8 imps to them. A good start.

In the Parioli-Chlodnia match, mainly the same happened in the Open Room:

East led a trump won by declarer who immediately

led a low club from the closed hand. When East rose with the ace and continued ♥A and another, the play was quickly over. Parioli +620 too.

At the other table, Pikus overcalled just 1♠ so he became declarer in 4♠ and got a diamond lead. According to the sound principle of establishing the side suit first he won the ace and immediately led a club to the queen and ace. East returned a trump and Pikus' next move was a club to the king. When West ruffed this, the contract suddenly was one down as the ♣J and ♥A were two inescapable losers. Parioli +100 and 12 imps to them.

On the next board, more fireworks in both matches.

Once Zorlu started off by the very forward-going move of 3♠ Besiktas could no longer stay out of slam. When 5NT confirmed the void the rest was easy: Zorlu had so much in reserve that he would always go to the grand once given the chance. Besiktas +1510 and 14 imps more to lead by 26 now –already enough to qualify, as it turned out later.

After the 4♠ splinter and 5♠ general try the Italians would never stay out of the grand any more. Well done by them, as usual, for +1510 and yet another 13 imps.

So as you can see, the foundations of the outcome of both these decisive matches were laid very early on. In the Brussels-Besiktas match not very much at all did happen after this lightning start. Parioli, on the other hand, went on and on with the one-way traffic to finally demolish their opponents 25-3 V.P.

So according to the rules and regulations it would once again be the traditional all-Italian semifinal. It might be an idea worth thinking about to change this rule, as this is not a national teams' contest but a club contest. On the other hand, changing the rule might well mean we will be having an all-Italian final for many years to come...

**Parioli v Allegra and Schaltz v Besiktas**

For many of us, the Italian semifinal very much looks like a final. As a consequence, one would tend to concentrate on that match, but that's not my idea for today. We have two semifinal matches in progress so why not try to cover them both?

In fact, covering the Parioli v. Allegra match would have been very much like broadcasting AS Roma v. Juventus in soccer: after one hour's play, that is to say well into the second half, Juventus opened the score to lead 1-0. When they went into the last three boards the score still stood at 1-0; I will turn my attention to that match after reporting about the happenings in the other match on the first nine boards.

On the first board, Schaltz took the lead in convincing fashion:

Well, had EW reached the spade slam here, we could only have regretted the disastrous trump break. To reach a slam would have been a tremendous performance anyway, so +420 was a just reward for sound bidding, even more so after the twosuit warning given by South in the auction.

The nice fancy opening bid did not do EW any good when East made the lead of the ♦Q. It gave declarer all four diamond tricks when the beer card appeared in West. What was worse: it also lost a tempo so Kandemir ended up with an over-trick.

1♥ was Canapé and 2♦ showed 3+ hearts, at least invitational. 3♦ and 3NT were natural and South led the ♠Q. As declarer had to lose tricks to the ♥Q, ♥A, ♦A and ♦J he could not come to nine tricks any more and went one down. On any other lead it would have been plain sailing. Well done by Besiktas, +50 to them.

At the other table, however, Peter Fredin did not trust the opponents' bidding completely and doubled for a spade lead. This would have led to down two and a small gain, but East surprisingly ran to 4♣ which went even three down on a trump lead. Schaltz 10 imps back to take the lead for the second time in the match.

On board 10, an extra undertrick gave Parioli 3 imps in their match, so they too went into the lead against Allegra, 3-1 at the time.

Bocchi started well after the lead of the ♥K: he played a spade to the jack and a low spade back to the ace. The third spade went to West's king and the ♦2 came back to the ace. Bocchi now proceeded to cash the last spade and the ♦K. East had discarded a diamond and a heart on the spades. If East had come down to his hearts and three clubs including the queen, which looked likely, he could be put in with the ♣Q to give dummy the game-going last heart trick, so declarer played accordingly. One down.

Fantoni followed a different line. ♥K lead, club to the ace and a spade to queen and king. A spade came back and Fantoni put up the jack. He then cashed the ♠9 and led the ♦J, covered with the queen and ace. East discarded two hearts on the last spade and the ♦K, but Fantoni next took the club finesse to land his contract. Parioli +600 and 12 imps to lead 18-1 after the first quarter.

In the other match, a swing to Schaltz looked likely for about 20 minutes as this is what happened in the Closed Room, where they were well ahead of the tempo in the other room:

The defence was excellent: ♦A, ♣J, ♦K, ♦ ruff, heart to king and ace, two top clubs and a spade to the ace. On the spade return to dummy's king, North had to come to one more trump trick for down four. Schaltz +800.

Well, this might have gone down five, but Schaltz saved a trick when he took a deep trump finesse. Down four, no swing. After the first set, Besiktas led 34-22, an interesting prospect for the afternoon.

Second quarter

For the first session after lunch the line-ups of all but one teams had been changed. Only the Allegra team continued with their original line-up, as they don't have much choice. So Di Bello-D'Avossa would face Angelini-Sementa whereas Lauria-Versace would face Bocchi-Duboin again, but turned at right angles. I will come back to this match in the report about the third quarter. In the other match, for Besiktas Kubac would replace Kandemir as Zorlu's partner, Senguler-Dogan would replace Tarhan and Kandemir. For Schaltz, Schaltz jr-Christiansen would continue and Bruun-Fredin would be replaced by the Schaltz couple. This replacement worked very well, as the Schaltzes gave us an impressive performance in what turned out to be a very good game overall.

The Besiktas NS pair showed some signs of over-optimism early on:

In the report on the third segment I suggested that both matches might well have been effectively over with just the final 12 boards to play. As we all know by now, this is exactly what happened so it will be Parioli v.Schaltz in today's final. Tonight you will be able to read about the outcome of a match that is looking a very fine prospect for today, but below I collected just a few examples of the way things went both finalists' way last night.

Take for example board 6:

Both major suit grands depend on not much more than a 3-2 trump break and no 5-0 break in the other major. Small slams should be even easier, so staying in game will not make you feel comfortable until you see the actual cruel distribution. In both matches, luck favoured the winners:


