Hi everyone.

We are somewhere at the middle of the tournament, and I can tell that you get what you expected, strong field, friendly people, and lot of adventures besides the playing rooms. Most ambitious of you are even going around, exploring nature beauties of Croatia, and the rest of us are getting pleasure from more artificial ones. I hope that you are all enjoying it.

We collected 94 teams at Mini teams tournament, and 156 pairs at Mixeds, with additional 104 pairs at Gentlemen's tournament.

We are really not surprised by winners of Mini teams,



but we still congratulate them, so, well done team Juls: Stefanov, Gunev, Nanev, Mihov, coming from Bulgaria, and Kriftner- Fritscher of Austria winners of Mixeds, and Niedzielski- Filipowicz best Gentlemen pair.

Tomorrow we start with Open teams tournament, probably the strongest competition here. We hope to beat a record of number of participants again, or at least to have over 100 teams. That shouldn't be a



problem, since quite a lot of new people arrived yesterday and today. As the tournament grows every year, we decided to enlarge the number of teams in A group (from 8 to 10). But, don't relax, it will still be very hard to qualify to group A. However, winners of every section get prize, and also the best ladies, mixed, junior, senior, national, international, cross-international and foreign team (you can find definitions of these categories inside this bulletin). Don't forget that we always have a special prize for the best player of the festival (usually free accommodation for the next year festival)!

Open team tournament will be broadcasted by BBO again, so I would like to thank them, especially Mr. Roland Wald, and our home vugraph operators Zoran Simec, Andrea Stankovic, Kristian Sentic and Tomica Rajcevic. We will broadcast one table (open and closed room).

Thanks to our sponsors we had free coffee during BAM teams and we will repeat that on the second day of Open teams. They will also treat us with some snacks on the first day of mini-teams. Thanks Franck!

OPEN TEAMS

Hi again. You/we did well yesterday with 260 pairs, 156 in mix contest and 104 men pairs. I hope you had good time and that you are satisfied with your result. If you are, for some strange reason, dissatisfied, there is still time for you in the upcoming events. One of them starting today, OPEN TEAMS. Now is your chance, pick a good partner, a good team and play well, and what can come in your way. Open team is the queen of the Festival, we will be on BBO, the whole world will be watching us next two days.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTEST

A team consists of 4-6 players. 5th and 6th player can be added later. CTD can exceptionally allow a 7th player.

The same player cannot, in any circumstances, play for 2 teams.

A team can change a player or a pair in the open room after half the boards of a round have been played.

Top 4 (5) tables use screens.

Special categories:

- mixed team = at least 2 female players
- women's team = 1 player can be male
- junior team = players up to 25 years, one can be older
- senior team = players over 58 years, one can be younger
- foreign team = 1 player can be from Croatia
- Cro-international team = at least 2 players from Croatia and 2 foreign players
- international team = players from at least two different countries

In the tournament, a team can have the Bye only once (Bye in the group does not count)

FIRST SESSION

Before the tournament starts, the organiser determines 1st and 2nd seeded. Then the draw forms groups of 4 teams. To all teams their competition numbers are given, by draw. Round Robin is played, 3 rounds of 8 boards, IMP/VP up to 12:0. In uncomplete groups Bye is 8 VPs, +7 IMPs.

After the RR the ranking in a group is determined considering:

- total VPs
- VPs of a direct match
- total IMPs
- IMPs of a direct match

SECOND SESSION

A Team that registered too late can join the tournament after the RR with 12 VPs, -18 IMPs.

2 teams with the best ranking from every group go to A group, and the rest to B group.

3 rounds of "Danish" are played, 8 boards each, IMP/VP up to 12:0.

Criteria for determining standings after first 2 rounds of sessions 2 and 3:

- total VPs
- total IMPs
- lower competition number

Criteria for determining standings after the 3rd round of sessions 2 and 3:

- total VPs
- total IMPs
- VP of the direct match (if more than one match, average of VPs)
- IMP of the direct match (if more than one match, average of IMPs)
- draw

THIRD SESSION

After the end of the 2nd session a certain number of teams (prearranged) form group A (around 50% of the teams from the former group A and several top teams from the former group B), and the rest play in group B.

3 rounds of "Danish" are played, 8 boards each, IMP/VP up to 12:0.

FOURTH SESSION

After the end of the third session 2 main and n consolation groups are formed.

A group = 8 top teams + 2 top team from B

B group = all the other teams from A + several best teams from B

Consolation groups = n groups, 8 teams each

3 rounds of "Danish" are played, 8 boards each, IMP/VP up to 12:0.

Criteria for determining the final standings:

- total VPs
- total IMPs
- VPs over last 3 rounds
- IMPs over last 3 rounds
- share the place and the prize

Endplays

In the Mini-Teams tournament these two nice hands came in the same match. One of them was played by young Gunn Tove Vist (27) from Team RKK (Norway). She is player who this year was allowed to play for Norwegian Woman Team, and she on the team who won the Nordic Championship.

Although Gunn Tove is one of the best woman players in Norway she is maybe more known for her poker performances, where winning the European title for women a few years ago is her best result.

Her nickname in the poker world and on BBO is Dronninga (the Queen). On this hand she played like a real Queen. But it was only possible with a little help from our friends. Would you have found the killing defence?

A diamond back from East will beat the contract, and may be East should have found that defence. But a very strong player at East's chair continued spades to The Queen's Queen. Now trump ace was played before cashing the second spade honour, and then ending playing West in trumps. West had only minor cards, and had to play back a diamond, or giving declarer for the club ace. Plus 790.

West led the spade king, and continued spades when declarer held back his ace. South won with the spade ace in the third round of the suit. Declarer need four trick in one of the minor suits to win his contract.

An interesting version of the hand would have been if West led the club king, which I probably would have done myself. On the ace the diamond 4 disappears, and declarer has two possible lines available. One, and probably the best one, is just to try the heart finesse which you can see fails, and that would have meant one down. The other line is to play a spade from dummy. East has to play low, and declarer wins the trick. Now to make the contract the Queen must have played the Queen of trumps(!), not the ace, a play that looks more normal. If she had made this brilliant play, the 6 of trumps had provided an entry to dummy, and declarer would have made her contract by playing a second round of spades towards her hand.

Club ace and king was played, and it would have been possible to make four club tricks if West's holding had been the ten or jack single, or double, finessing over East's holding after taking out West's clubs. Of course declarer could - with open cards - have doublefinessed East's holding as it was, but that is probably not the percentage play.

Just a few hands later, another interesting play occurred (removed to get South as declarer).

Now the ace of diamonds was cashed, followed by the ace of hearts, stripping East for anything but minor cards. Then club to the queen and another club. East was able to take two club tricks, but then she had to play a diamond from her jack, giving declarer four tricks in that suit, and a total of nine.

Defenders

It's easy to win the competition, but how do you defend the title?

Winning the Mixed teams for team «Franck» last year looked like Walt Whitman's song: «Leaves of Grass» also known as «Piece of cake».

But the ancient Chinese saying and the oldest rule of any serious competition says: «It is always easier to win than to defend the title». And it has been proven once again.

The team "Franck" was slightly changed, they lost Trumpi and SchTsch but they were strengthened with great Hungarian players Syl and his partner Susanne.

First match, second, third ...everything was going as they planned. After fifth round they were first.

Last round Franck was at the table 1, leading their opponents polish team «Big slick» by 2 VP. And then the previously mentioned rule defined their dark destiny. It all happened on 8 boards after which they dropped to the 9th place.

First hand in closed room was just warm up for the "Big slick". They bid a game and made an over trick. Now the horror for Baby_duck and Mightyduck begins. The bidding starts with 1d opening by Mighty and it continues...

- 1♦ – 2♦*
- 2♠* – 2nt
- 3♦ – 3nt
- 4♦ – 4♥
- 4nt – 5♦
- 6♦ – all pass

2♦ – inverted minor (can be only invitational)

2♠ – establishing game forcing with spades

Here is the whole hand:

- ♠ AK10x
- ♥ xx
- ♦ AKxxxx

Defender led the ace of clubs, then switched to heart, taken by the dummy's Ace, and the declarer discarded the losing heart on the king of clubs. Then he played three rounds of diamonds and the last chance of QJ of spades on side didn't succeed. One down. In the open room EW were in 3nt making with two overtricks for –13 IMPs ☹.

That was followed by 3s played by south Mrs Czezko. Minor mistake in defending and the lady makes it. In open room NS were in 4sx for –300. Another lost of 11 IMPs for team "Franck". Next one the "Big slick" ends up in 3nt after Mightyduck and Baby_duck interfered with diamonds. Just made. Open room – 3NT one down.

Is that enough for you? It was surely enough for the "Big slick" to win 12:0 and to triumph in this year's Mixed teams. Well done for "Big slick", congratulations!!!

I get the lucky lead of ♥ for my Q on which i can discard 1 diamond from the dummy and the other goes on the Ace of ♥. I lead the 10♠ covered by the Q and taken by K. Small ♣ is lead for a ruff in hand and trump to the table for 13 tricks.....

Later the opponents came to congratulate and explained us that till this very last round they had'nt lost any. Some mixup in THEIR previous scoring sheet put them on a wrong table. They should have played at table 7 and not 17 (they definitely came to THE WRONG TABLE.....)
